Sadly, when researching men or women who served in other related armed forces, such as the British Indian Army, or the West and East African elements of the British Army, information is more difficult to obtain. Most of the records of men who served in the British Indian Army were retained at the Regimental Centres when British India partitioned in August 1947. They are, therefore, to be found in modern day Bangladesh, India and Pakistan. Individual Regimental Centres are very keen to help if they can, but locating an individual person is very difficult

Royal Navy registers of reports of deaths on ships (1893–1950)

Download, for free, digital microfilm copies of indexes to registers of reports of deaths on Royal Navy ships in <u>ADM 104/102–108</u> and the respective registers themselves in <u>ADM 104/109–118</u> and <u>ADM 104/122–139</u>. The registers include name, age and rank of each seaman, the ship on which they were serving at the time of their death, with the date, place and cause of their death.

Royal Navy registers of killed and wounded (1854–1911 and 1914–1929)

Download, for free, digital microfilm copies of the Royal Navy registers of killed and wounded 1854–1911 and 1914–1929 in <u>ADM 104/144–149</u>. Indexes to these records for 1915–1929 are in <u>ADM 104/140–143</u>. The registers include name, age and rank of seamen, the ship on which they were serving and the date, place and circumstances of their injury or death.

British Army and Royal Navy birth, marriage and death records (1730–1960)

Search for a range of different types of <u>British Army and Royal Navy birth,</u> <u>marriage and death records</u> (charges apply), including baptism and burial records and registers of marriages and deaths, at Ancestry.co.uk. The records span a variety of year ranges between 1730 and 1960 and are from multiple <u>ADM</u> and <u>WO</u> record series.

Indexes to births, marriages and deaths in the armed forces (1761–1995)

Search <u>indexes</u> to the <u>regimental registers</u>, <u>British Army chaplains' registers</u>, <u>army returns and service departments registers</u> in the military section on findmypast (charges apply). The related certificates can be obtained from the <u>General Register Office</u>.

The indexes to the regimental registers give a name, place, year and regiment.

Army chaplains' registers (1796–1880) relate to births, marriages and deaths overseas. The index gives a name, place and date range of two to three years.

Service departments registers of births and marriages (1956–1965) relate to army, navy and air force births and marriages abroad.

Royal Navy seamen wills (1786-1882)

Search and download <u>wills of Royal Navy and Royal Marines</u> <u>personnel</u> (charges apply) from ADM 48.

Records available only at The National Archives in Kew

To access these records you will either need to <u>visit us</u>, <u>pay for research</u> (charges apply) or, where you can identify a specific record reference, <u>order</u> a copy (charges apply).

Army registers of baptisms, marriages and burials in UK and overseas garrisons (1808-2007)

Browse Discovery, our catalogue, in record series <u>WO 156</u> to see which garrison records are held by The National Archives. The registers are relatively few in number and mainly date from the 20th century.

RAF Chaplaincy Board registers of baptisms, confirmations, marriages and burials (1919-2009)

Browse our catalogue, in record series <u>AIR 82</u> for registers of baptisms, confirmations, burials, and marriage (including banns) which were kept at various RAF stations in the British Isles and overseas. The records are searchable by name of RAF station/country and not by name of individual.

Royal Navy Chaplaincy records of baptisms, marriages and burials (1845-1998)

Browse in <u>ADM 338</u> for registers of baptisms, marriages and burials by the Chaplain of the Fleet. These will mostly cover Royal Navy personnel but can also include civilians of any national.
